A slew of new bikes has been introduced or announced by various manufacturers and it seems the fight for market share is getting fierce.

**Indian** has added more models to the lineup and is seriously giving Harley Davidson something to chew on. Next to the Indian Chief Classic and Vintage, we now have the Chieftain, the Scout and the Roadmaster. Prices range from \$10,999.- to \$26,999.-... **Yikes!**



Not that **Polaris**, the company behind the reborn Indian marque is content with that. They also try to take a bite out of CanAm's business that they enjoy with the Spyder. Look at the "Slingshot". A new take on the old Morgan 3-Wheeler. Side by side sitting and a steering wheel. Classified as a motorcycle, but you don't need a motorcycle license. What has the world come to...?? 173hp 166 lb-ft. Prices from \$19,999.- to \$23,999.-



The "Adventure War" continues. After a new BMW GS Adventure, a Suzuki V-Strom Adventure, **KTM** now brings out a 1290 Super Adventure which will be the sport touring version of the KTM 1190 Adventure. Rumors say that the new model will share the same engine with the 1290 Super Duke R, it will feature Motorcycle Stability Control (MSC), ABS, various riding modes and traction control, and it will be fitted with a relatively large fuel tank which will translate in a better riding range.



**BMW** announced several new variations for 2015: A K1300S Motorsport with a unique paint scheme and several HP accessories added. The R1200GS and GSA get Keyless Ride and GSA Pro options. The GS gets the heavier crank from the GSA. Both K1600GT and GTL get DTC, Hill Start Control and daytime running light as standard equipment and Keyless Ride as an option. The new instrument panel from the GTL Exclusive is now standard on all models.

As you read this, the first contingency of club members may be on their way to the **Finger Lakes Rally**, August 29 to September 1 at Watkins Glen. You can still make a run for it.

If you have all the time in the world, you can go on from there to the **Green Mountain Rally** September 5 - 7 at Camp Thorpe in Goshen, Vermont. Attendance limited to 250, however.
