The month of May came and went without much happening other than our Poker Run and the Georgia Mountain Rally for a few. Going on are the **RA Iowa Rally June 9th through 12th** in Amana, IA, and the **Americade** in Lake George, NY **June 7-11**.

Plans are in order to make for **AMA Vintage Days** at Mid-Ohio, **July 8-10** and, then the **MOA International Rally** in Hamburg, NY on **July 14-16**.

One of the great names in Motorcycles, MV Agusta, is reported to be in trouble again! The plant is currently closed, workers are scheduled to be laid off and a new investor is being looked for. After Harley Davidson and Mercedes Benz AMG could not save them, rumor has it that Polaris may try their hand now. Hopefully, the success with Victory and Indian has not made them too cocky.



Another ownership change for a famous classic name brand: **Bell Helmets**, founded in 1954 by Roy Richter in a garage in Bell, CA was sold by BRG Sports, owners of the Riddell helmet and body armour brand to Vista Outdoor Inc., a major manufacturer of shooting sports and outdoor products.



Another challenger to the BMW R1200GS has emerged in Ducati's new Multistrada 1200 Enduro. To make it more suitable for off-road riding, the wheels are now spoked 19/17 inch f/r, a 7.9 inch suspension travel, up from 6.7 inch and 7.9 gal (vs 5.3) fuel capacity for approx 280 miles between fill-ups. So far, only available in Europe, however.

The German company Wunderlich, a BMW accessory manufacturer has revealed a BMW R1200GS LC with two-wheel drive, the front wheel with a 10 kW electrical gearbox. The front wheel can even be used without the GS motor running at up to 20 km/h (12.5 mph). Currently, the kit remains a prototype.
